Switching Mediums: Oils to Acrylics

with Julie Anderson

Curious about acrylic or JoSonja paint? Have you been experimenting with acrylic paint and frustrated? Are you an instructor and allow painters to use a different paint than you are in the class? This online INRA class is designed for oil painters who want to develop acrylic painting skills. Acrylic painters who are not getting the results they want may also find some of the skills taught in this class helpful and are welcome. Learn how acrylic paint handles differently through lecture and hands-on practice. We will cover brush loading, paint consistency, blending techniques, glazing, methods to clean up mistakes and use of mediums. We'll also discuss brush cleaning, studio safety.

For the "hands-on" part of this class, participants should select a design they have painted before. It is easier to focus on painting techniques if you know how to paint the design and are using the same color scheme as you used in the past. Julie will have a simple design for your use if you choose not to select a design you have painted before and will include a palette for her design on the supply list.

Students are encouraged to use a woodenware piece of their choice but practice boards are a great option. Julie will demonstrate in acrylics for this class. Zoom sessions will meet on Wednesday March 18 & 25, 2026 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., Central time.

TEACHER BIOGRAPHY:

I have been teaching Rosemaling since 1998 and virtually since the fall of 2020. I am passionate about sharing what I know and love seeing the joy that comes up when someone learns something new or masters a skill. I teach mainly in the Hallingdal, Telemark and Os styles focusing on helping artists learn techniques, how to interpret old work, color, design and ways to express themselves in their painting.



I also paint and teach other styles of folk art, such as Swedish Dalamalning/Kurbits and German Bauernmalerei, and have studied with American, Norwegian and Swedish artists who paint these styles. I have an honorable mention in the 2019 Vesterheim Norwegian American Museum National Norwegian-American Folk Art Exhibition and have been featured in the Artist Spotlight by MacPherson's: <https://wetpaintart.wordpress.com/2020/03/05/instructor-spotlight-julie-anderson-living-traditions-the-magnetic-pull-of-folk-art/>.
